The Fairy Queen waved her wand.


She changed the frog into a Prince. It was **magic**.

They will sing.




man

She likes meeting Kitty.




melt

The day comes to an end at **midnight**.




milk

The cock crows early in the **morning**.




mother

We eat and speak with our **mouths**.




move
