He is obeying Jack's orders




o'clock

old




Old Mother Goose when

I have heard it one time.




one

open



The first door is **open**.

Is it a cat, **or** a dog, **or** a bear, **or** a cow?




orange

Spot brings the ball. He does what Jack has ordered.




Mother goes to the shop to order things.

she might fall **over**.




She has flown **over** and **over** again. She has flown
